STAGEWORKS/HUDSON PRESENTS THE KALIYUGA ARTS PRODUCTION OF TRUE LOVE LIES

May 9 to 19, 2013

Hudson, NY - Stageworks/Hudson will present the Kaliyuga Arts production of **TRUE LOVE LIES** by Brad Fraser. There will be a "Pay What You Want" Preview on Thursday, May 9. TRUE LOVE LIES opens Friday, May 10 and runs through May 19. The play is directed by John Sowle, artistic director of Kaliyuga Arts. TRUE LOVE LIES follows the further adventures of David McMillan, a character first introduced in Fraser's WOLF BOY and developed further in his plays UNIDENTIFIED HUMAN REMAINS AND THE TRUE NATURE OF LOVE and POOR SUPER MAN. Alone, adrift and now entering his 50s, David has returned to Toronto to open a new restaurant. There he re-encounters Kane Sawatsky, with whom he once had a two-year relationship that did not end well. Kane is now married, and he and his wife Carolyn have two kids – Madison, a brash and self-assured 20-year-old and Royce, an insecure, geeky teenager - neither of whom has any idea that their father was once involved in a homosexual relationship. Almost against their wills these characters get sucked into one another's orbits, old wounds get re-opened, old lies exposed, sparks fly, and all of them are forced to re-evaluate everything they think they know about love, marriage, and family. There have been multiple productions mounted in the U.K., Canada and the U.S., and the play has been hailed as audacious, smart, sexy, witty and Fraser's finest thus far.

"Kaliyuga Arts has a history with Brad Fraser," comments John Sowle, Kaliyuga artistic director and director of TRUE LOVE LIES. "Kaliyuga produced his play POOR SUPER MAN in San Francisco in 1997 and it still ranks as one of the most artistically fulfilling projects Kaliyuga has ever mounted. Besides being hilariously funny one minute and deeply moving the next, Brad's work is always adult, insightful and incredibly entertaining. One of the things most compelling about TRUE LOVE LIES is the intrigue – that wonderful sense of 'Wow! What's going to happen next?' He tells a terrific story without sacrificing depth of character, and that has become increasingly rare in the theater we see today."

The cast of TRUE LOVE LIES includes veteran actors Kevin Craig West who recently appear in Cap Rep's production of RACE and Steven Patterson and Molly Parker-Myers who both appeared in Kaliyuga Arts' production of THE MOUND BUILDERS last season. Rounding out the cast are newcomers to Kaliyuga, Anna Chazelle and Samuel Hoeksema.

KAILYUGA ARTS

Kaliyuga Arts, founded in 1986 and known for many award-winning productions in Los Angeles, San Francisco and New York City, follows its acclaimed local production of Lanford Wilson's THE MOUND BUILDERS last year with the area premiere of the latest play from the provocative Canadian playwright Brad Fraser. TRUE LOVE LIES will be presented for eight performances only, May 9-19, at Stageworks in Hudson, NY.

BIOS

BRAD FRASER (Playwright) first came to prominence as a playwright with UNIDENTIFIED HUMAN REMAINS AND THE TRUE NATURE OF LOVE, an episodically structured play about a group of thirty somethings trying to find their way through life in Edmonton, Alberta, while the city is haunted by a serial killer. It was a hit at the Alberta Theatre Projects' playRites '89, and numerous highly acclaimed productions followed, including tremendously popular productions in Toronto and Chicago. The play was named one of the 10 Best Plays of 1992 by TIME. His next script, POOR SUPER MAN, had its premiere in Cincinnati, Ohio. Coming three years after the 1991 Robert Mapplethorpe controversy in Cincinnati, POOR SUPER MAN inspired international headlines when the board of directors of Ensemble Theatre of Cincinnati temporarily canceled the production because of its anticipated obscenity. After a public outcry, the production was reinstated. POOR SUPER MAN opened without incident and played to considerable acclaim. It was named one of the 10 Best Plays of 1994 by TIME. Fraser has been especially successful in the U.K., where his work has enjoyed both critical and popular success, beginning with London's Evening Standard Award for UNIDENTIFIED HUMAN REMAINS in 1993. Fraser's work references heavily typical popular culture, especially comic books, horror films and primetime television, and is often more highly valued in retrospect than when it first opens. In addition to his theatre work, Fraser has written two films, LOVE AND HUMAN REMAINS and LEAVING METROPOLIS, both adaptations of his plays. He has also written for the television series QUEER AS FOLK, was host of his own

Toronto-based television talk show, Jawbreaker, and for a period of time wrote a biweekly column for the Canadian gay magazine "fab". His latest play, KILL ME NOW, will have its world premiere in Edmonton this fall.

JOHN SOWLE (Director) has produced, directed, designed and performed in hundreds of productions over the years. He founded Kaliyuga Arts in 1986 with his partner Steven Patterson and has received multiple awards for his directing and design work for their Los Angeles, San Francisco and New York productions. Last year he directed and designed THE MOUND BUILDERS at Stageworks. John has co-directed (with Laura Margolis) the PLAY BY PLAY series at Stageworks/Hudson for the last three years. He also created the set and lights for their production of TENNIS IN NABLUS. In Manhattan, John recently directed and designed Beckett's ALL THAT FALL and Dan Carbone's KINGDOM OF NOT at the Cherry Lane and IN CIRCLES, a musical by Al Carmines based on the work of Gertrude Stein. John received his PhD in Dramatic Art from UC Berkeley.

KEVIN CRAIG WEST (David) is an award-winning actor/filmmaker and proud member of SAG, AFTRA and AEA. Some of his favorite stage credits include Eros/Bacchus/Vertumnus/Ceyx/Hermes in METAMORPHOSES, Henry Brown in RACE, Oberon in MIDSUMMER NIGHT'S DREAM, Mr M in MY CHILDREN! MY AFRICA! and Sam in MASTER HAROLD AND THE BOYS. Some of his on camera favorites are Sargeant Raimo in THE PLACE BEYOND THE PINES, Mavis in BUMPIN UGLIES, Dick in DISTRACTIONS, Steve in ORPHANED and Frank in LITTLE BI PEEP. When not on camera or stage, he enjoys producing, directing, writing and coaching. He also enjoys sharing his talents as a teacher/artist and has worked with many Arts in Education groups including Theatre for a New Audience, Only Make Believe, and Symphony Space. Kevin is the owner of the production company, MoBetta Films an advisory board member of WAM Theatre as well as Lake Placid Film Forum, President of Upstate Independents and has served as Assistant Director of FilmColumbia Festival. STEVEN PATTERSON (Kane) has performed in New York City and regionally with such theaters as South Coast Repertory, TheatreWorks, Capital Repertory, Lexington Conservatory Theatre, freeFall Theatre, Chenango River Theatre, Centenary Stage Company, Depot Theatre, Contemporary Opera Marin, and the Oregon, Orlando, Colorado, Pennsylvania, Utah, and Lake Tahoe Shakespeare Festivals. A few of his favorite roles have been King Lear, Jean Genet in BEAUTY, Austin Wiggin in THE SHAGGS: PHILOSOPHY OF THE WORLD, David in POOR SUPER MAN, Zach in A CHORUS LINE, the Creature in FRANKENSTEIN, Ubu in UBU REX, and Judi Boswell in HOW TO PRAY. He mostly recently played Claudius in the Tennessee Shakespeare Company's production of HAMLET. Steven is the Co-Artistic Director of Kaliyuga Arts; he currently resides in Catskill, NY.

MOLLY PARKER-MYERS (Carolyn) Molly is an actor and singer based in the Hudson Valley. Molly is delighted to work with the Kaliyuga Arts team again, after appearing in last year's production of THE MOUND BUILDERS (Cynthia). Other

recent credits include THE DIVINE SISTER (Mrs. Levinson/Timothy) and FORBIDDEN BROADWAY at Stageworks/Hudson, THE LADIES MAN (Marie) at Shadowland Theatre and THE SOUND OF MUSIC (Elsa) at TriArts Sharon Playhouse. Favorite roles include THE LANGUAGE ARCHIVE (Mary), HAIRSPRAY (Velma), THE DROWSY CHAPERONE (The Drowsy Chaperone), DIRTY ROTTEN SCOUNDRELS (Muriel Eubanks) AND FALSETTOS (Doctor Charlotte).

ANNA CHAZELLE (Madison) is an NYC-based actress, singer, and circus performer. She is an alumnus of New York University and has additionally trained at the Atlantic Acting School and The Shakespeare Forum.
