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## CHERRY LANE THEATRE HOSTS RARE STAGING OF SAMUEL BECKETT'S ALL THAT FALL MAY 24TH THROUGH JUNE 3RD

To celebrate Samuel Beckett's hundredth birthday year, Kaliyuga Arts will present, for two weeks only, a rare staging of Beckett's *All That Fall* at the historic Cherry Lane Theatre, 38 Commerce Street in Greenwich Village, which in the past has hosted two American premieres of Beckett's work, *Endgame* in 1958 and *Happy Days* in 1961.

After Beckett's astounding success with <u>Waiting for Godot</u> and <u>Endgame</u>, written originally in French, BBC Radio commissioned him to write a radio play, and Beckett used the opportunity to return to writing in English. The result was <u>All That Fall</u>, which was originally broadcast in 1956 and has been broadcast since in celebrated productions all over the world. The play follows Maddy Rooney, an ancient woman "destroyed with sorrow and pining and gentility and church-going and fat and rheumatism and childlessness," on a perilous journey to the train station to meet her blind husband on his birthday (he "may be a hundred") and accompany him home through the wind and the rain. On the way she encounters a succession of vivid characters (<u>All That Fall</u> has the largest cast of any of Beckett's plays), most based on people Beckett knew in his youth. The play is a riotous, existential romp that is so rich with innuendo it has been called "a tour-de-force in audial pornography." David Mamet, when asked recently by the <u>New York Times</u> for a theory on Beckett's influence, replied, "He was a great kisser." No Beckett play better illustrates the truth of that "theory" than **All That Fall**.

Kaliyuga Arts, "rendering oddities with grace and insight since 1986," has produced many award-winning works in Los Angeles, San Francisco and worldwide. The company is now based in New York City, and this is their first production here. *All That Fall* will be performed in the style of an old-time radio play, with actors holding scripts and gathered around microphones. Foley artists will perform most of the complex sound score on stage. John Sowle, co-artistic director of Kaliyuga Arts, directs. The cast features Helen Calthorpe as Maddy Rooney and Rand Mitchell as her husband, Dan. Sara Bader creates the sound design
